VI YOUTH GRADUATE FROM 6 WEEK VIPCA MARINE YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP

MRF funded VIPCA's inaugural intensive Marine Apprenticeship this June-July which provided training to seven young adults from St. Thomas and St. John in the marine charter industry in partnership with Cruise Ship Excursions (SSX). Students learned to swim, SCUBA dive, navigate, maintain vessels and diesel engines, and how to captain and crew sail and power boats with and without passengers. VIPCA sponsored the students through the five-day STCW Basic Training and will continue to mentor them to careers as captains and crew. Several apprentices now work for CSE and one applied to join the USCG.

MY BROTHERS WORKSHOP - MARINE, FOUNDED BY MARINE REBUILD FUND

Newly launched this September, MBW-Marine offers year round vocational training to at-risk youth in marine maintenance services. The territory's need for a marine trade school drove VIPCA to grantwrite for this cause though its charity Marine Rebuild Fund. MRF received initial funding of \$200,000 from Fund For The Virgin Islands (FFVI) at the Community Foundation of the Virgin Islands (CFVI) for MBW-Marine's inaugural year.
